• Ark's Asset Team will carry out a survey to check the condition of our properties to make sure they are good quality.




• We will create a Community Benefit Fund that our Housing and Maintenance Officers will use for initiatives that tenants have identified.

They made plans to talk about these issues with their staff and they talked about making new friendships at Dates-n-mates!



A Disability Hate Crime includes things like bullying and harassment.





Health & Safety Update





COVID-19 Rapid Test

Community pharmacies in Scotland are now providing free rapid Lateral Flow Device (LFD) Covid-19 tests for everyone in Scotland who does not have coronavirus symptoms.

These rapid tests are simple and quick to use and you can do them at home.

Stay safe this summer. Avoid sunburn and overheating by following these tips:

- Cover your skin during 11am and 3pm
- Wear loose clothing and a hat
- Shut windows and blinds to help keep your rooms cool
- Drink water regularly
- Have cool baths and showers
- Use sunscreen with a high factor (50)
- If you feel unwell, tell someone.





Complaints Update



Between January and March 2021, Ark received 11 complaints:

- 7 were about Care and Support
- 3 were about Asset Management
- 1 was about other departments.

We looked at each of these complaints. We agreed with 3 complaints, we partially agreed with 5 and we did not agree with 3.

Learning from complaints...

Some of the complaints we received this quarter were repairs not being carried out.

The Asset team explained the government advice to the tenants and they agreed to organise checks on the properties once restrictions are lifted.
